



Quarterly BIEAC Project Status Report: March 2009

Building an Inclusive East African Community (BIEAC) project was launched by CUTS International in December 2008 with the assistance of Deutsche Gesellschaft für Technische Zusammenarbeit (GTZ), Germany.

The BIEAC project is well under way, with the main activities being the organisation of Awareness Workshops and undertaking research on selected topics.

The first awareness workshops were successfully held in February 2009 in Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania. Workshops in Burundi and Rwanda are scheduled in early April 2009.

Research has commenced on seven (7) topics regarding the EC/EAC EPA, envisaged to be completed by the end of March/early April 2009. The research work is being undertaken by research partners from the EAC member states as well by the relevant experts in CUTS International. Input from legal experts will also be utilised to review the issues discussed. The topics covered and those undertaking the work are indicated below:
